Once again, Horizon 5<sup>th</sup> graders had the opportunity to attend JA Biztown. This is such a fantastic opportunity for our students. Throughout the year, students work to prepare for their day at Biztown. They each complete a job application and are then placed in a business that meets their interests. Throughout their day at Biztown, students do their jobs so that the business can pay their rent. They receive two paychecks during the day that they deposit at the town bank. They invest part of their earnings and can then spend the rest at various shops by using checks, cash, or a credit card. They track their income and expenses in a checkbook ledger. There are students working at the bank, city hall, medical clinic, restaurant, newspaper, music store, construction firm, investment firm, and many more. Many students say it's their favorite thing about 5<sup>th</sup> grade (and they learn something as part of it!)

## **BOX TOPS**

Congratulations to Mrs. McGrann's 2nd grade class! Their class won the box top collection contest and enjoyed a class popcorn party! They collected over 200 box tops. This year, Horizon raised \$941 that the PTO can use to fund special projects and field trips for Horizon teachers and students!
