


THANK YOU!

BOOK FAIR

THANK YOU to everyone who gave generously of your time to pitch in with setting up, decorating, cashiering, stapling, counting out flyers, and for supporting our book fair. We couldn't have done it without you!

We collected \$957.06 in change during our All For Books Coin Challenge! This money went directly to your child's teacher to use at the Book Fair. PTO also matched 50% of what was raised and purchased new books for Horizon's Reading Specialists. Mrs. Whitney's class brought in the most money and won the STEM kits by bringing in over \$102 in coins!

Because of your service and everyone's generous donations and purchases, we raised \$1,268.36 in cash for the Horizon Media Center, \$2,200 in Scholastic Dollars to fund gift certificates for teachers, students and volunteers, and donate \$479 in NEW books to Horizon's Reading Specialists. That's a total of \$3,947.36 raised to support literacy at Horizon!
